Cr E Barker commented that the Tirau Swimming Pool – Toddlers Pool is to be upgraded before summer.

Mr May asked why a tender wasn't called for. Mr Morris to query and get back to Mr May.

Meeting was adjourned at 7.40 pm to receive a presentation from Kevin Gray on his vision for the Tirau Domain being used for an equine facility – SUPA (Schools, Universities Polo Academy). Mr Gray outlined the background of SUPA and talked about how he would be wanting to lease the Tirau Domain and he would maintain it. He was aware that the access to the Domain was a concern but believed in the interim he would be able to manage the problem as it would only be his vehicle going in and out of the Domain. Mayor N Sinclair advised that Land Transport Authority had put aside \$1.5 million to tidy up the intersection for 2011 and he would hope that the safe entry into the Domain would be addressed at this stage. Mr Gray advised that he would envisaged that members of the public would still be allowed access to the Domain. His long term vision, everything going well would be to build an arena so that it could be used 12 months of the year. Mr Gray tabled a map showing marked areas for the arenas. Discussion was held about the access and the need for Traffic Management Plans.

Cr E Barker said that she thought it was a great vision and proposal. She would love to see something like that in the Domain and she liked the involvement of schools and young people and wished Mr Gray well. It helping the youth of the district giving them another alternative.

Mrs Martelletti advised that there was a process to go through and that each tender would be judged on their merit. Council make the decision but take into account the Community Board's opinion.

Matters Arising

Mrs N Martelletti advised that at the hearing she tried to get Council to be aware of the continued pressure of toilet use and that it was not always buses but the increasing number of people spending the day in Tirau. It was also expected that once the Glade Toilets closed there would be an increase in people using the facilities in Tirau. Mayor N Sinclair advised he had preliminary discussions with the Tirau Hotel and that they were very positive. Mr R Fisher will be meeting with them to discuss further. Mrs Martelletti indicated that if this was done for a year we would then have a good indication of the actual use. It all was still dependent on the current Lessee.

Mayor N Sinclair advised that 200 letters to the Tapapa Okororie residents were posted today advising of the meetings to be held on 7 and 8 July. The current thinking was to move the Tapapa Hall onto land at the Kurunui School, subject to obtaining the land, and then close down the Okororie Hall. This still has to go to the community. Cr E Barker advised that the idea was to get down to one hall in the area and a combined hall rating area.

Mayor N Sinclair advised that the Economic Development in the region is remarkable. He was impressed with the Tirau business community and their involvement in the Field Days shop windows. There is lots of potential for development.

5.3 Signage – Public Toilets

Cr E Barker asked if a generic sign could be provided to businesses who provided public use to their toilets that could be placed in the front to alert public of the facilities. Mr Morris advised that Mr Fisher was looking into the provision of signage and that he was also renegotiating with the new Caltex Managers over the night access.

5.4 Domain Surplus Funds**5.6 Tirau Domain Reserve Funds**

Mr Morris tabled his report and advised what had happened to the funds. Discussion was had on what the funds were to be used for when the Tirau Domain Board amalgamated. Mr May voiced his understanding that the money was not to be used for operating costs. It was the direction of the Domain Board that they be handed over to the people of Tirau. The Tirau Lions had received a letter from the Domain Board saying there would be some money coming and asking that they distribute it around the community. Mr May is to obtain a copy

of that letter. Mrs T Dillon asked "where to from here?" She asked why no rental had been received over the 2007-08 year and why the increase had not been applied. Mr Morris will follow through and address these issues. Mr Morris will take it up with the Tirau Domain Board.

5.5 Safer Community Council Report

Mrs T Dillon advised she had represented the Community Board at the Safer Community Council meeting on 19 May 2009. They were pleased to get a contract for three years. Priorities were put in place for 2009-10 – Family, Gambling, Youth Offending. Alterations were being made to the Business Strategic Plan before it is adopted. The Super Maori fellows are coming to Tokoroa on 1 July 2009. Question was asked about what plans Council has in place in case of the Swine Flu. Mayor N Sinclair advised that it would be implemented like the Bird Flu. Management of it rather than containment. Bird Flu plan is still in operation. At this stage we don't have any cases in the South Waikato.

5.7 Church Street Development Workshop

Mrs Martelletti will liaise with Greg Shaw and advise a date for an on-site workshop.

6.0 Members' Information Requests

Cr E Barker had been asked about the cost of the food stall at the Market and had been told it was excessive compared to other Councils. Concern was that whether they operate for 12 days or 365 days they pay the same fee. Mayor N Sinclair had spoken with J Anderson, Team Leader Health who advised that it was worked out on a user pays scale. A licence could be purchased for three months, six months or a year. The organisers of the market had put a lot of work into it and they had visited all businesses and had done advertising. Generally it was good for Tirau and brought more people into the town. The quality of the market was really good. Discussion was held on parking in town and the Loading Zone in front of Subway. Cr Barker also mentioned that the Bread stall from Cambridge is seriously thinking of having an outlet in Tirau.

Mr May asked if the oak tree leaves in Bridge Street could be cleaned up. They were over the footpath and onto the road and frosted over which is quite dangerous. Mrs Martelletti mentioned the trees on the bank needed trimming as well.

Subject: Electoral Representation Review 2009

(Please bring the material presented at the 6 August Workshop.)

Purpose of Report

To enable Council to decide its representation arrangements for the Triennial elections next year.

Background**A brief history of electoral representation in the South Waikato District.**

1. The first election of members was in 1989. That council comprised 14 members plus the Mayor. Election of Councillors was from the following wards;

Tirau	- 2 members
Putaruru	- 4 members
Tokoroa East	- 4 members
Tokoroa West	- 4 members

There were two Community Boards;

Tirau	- 6 elected members
Putaruru	- 6 elected members

2. There was no change 'for the 1992 elections'.
3. As a result of a Representation Review in 1994, for the 1995 election, 10 councillors plus Mayor were elected. The councillors were elected from wards, as follows;

Tirau	- 1 member
Putaruru	- 3 members
Tokoroa	- 6 members

(The boundary between the Tokoroa East and West Wards had been removed, and part of the boundary between the Tokoroa and Putaruru Wards had been relocated to run along Wiltsdown Road).

Community Boards

Tirau	- 6 members
Putaruru	- 6 members

4. There was no change for the 1998 elections. However, in 1999 the Putaruru Community Board recommended to Council that the Board be voted out of existence. This duly happened.
5. There was no change for the 2001 and 2004 elections, except that there was no longer a Putaruru Community Board.
6. Following a Representation Review in 2006, for the 2007 elections, part of the boundary between the Tokoroa and Putaruru Wards was moved southwards from Wiltsdown Road to Matanuku and Rollet Roads, and the Tirau Community Board was reduced to 4 elected members.

That is the scheme under which you were elected.

Issues

At the Workshop, there seemed to be a preference for the following arrangements for council representation.

1. Election in three wards;
2. Representation being
 - Tirau Ward - 1 member
 - Putaruru Ward - 3 members
 - Tokoroa Ward - 6 members
3. That part of the boundary line between the Tokoroa and Putaruru Wards currently running along Matanuku and Rollet roads being relocated back to Wiltsdown Road. (The issues here is that this departs from the +/- 10% rule in section 19 V(2) of the Electoral Act. I shall deal with this in the Discussion section below.)
4. Retention of the Tirau Community Board.

Discussion

The Preferred Option – Adjusting the Tokoroa/Putaruru Ward boundary.

The ramifications of not complying with the +/- 10% rule are:

1. The public notice of Council's proposal must include both the population, and the number of representatives, for each ward;
2. A copy of the public notice must be sent to the Local Government Commission ("LGC");
3. The LGC should notice that the proposal does not comply;
4. LGC could ask why not, and what will be done to remedy it;
5. LGC potentially could make or organise a submission and or institute legal proceedings for a breach of the Act;
6. Whatever decision Council comes to on any submission, there would have to be a further public notification of that decision, and either the same, or an amended, proposal;
7. If there are any appeals or objections to this proposal, these must be referred to the LGC for a final determination;
8. Potentially, the LGC could appeal if this proposal breached the +/- 10% rule.

In my opinion, the end result of following the preferred option could well be the LGC making the final determination of the 2010 Election Representation arrangements.

Other Options

These include;

- A. Not proceeding with the review. This would mean having to do the next review in 2012.
- B. Publishing a proposal that retains the status quo. This would give any elector who wanted to see a change the opportunity to make a submission including those electors who had voiced disappointment at being transferred from the Tokoroa to the Putaruru Ward in 2006. Further, if those electors are surveyed, it could ascertain the numbers of them who think they should be in the Tokoroa Ward, or the Putaruru Ward, as the case may be.
- C. Any other option, including any of those put forward in the Workshop material.

Current Estimated Population Figures

I have set out below the current population figures as at 30 June 2008, the latest available from the Department of Statistics. The figures in brackets are those for 30 June 2005, before the Tokoroa/Putaruru boundary adjustment, and the respective increase/decrease;

Tirau Ward -	2,200	(2,120)	+80
Putaruru Ward -	6,560	(6,040)	+520
Tokoroa -	14,050	(14,700)	-650
TOTALS	<u>22,810</u>	<u>22,860</u>	

Under the current arrangement, the +/- 10% formula results in the following:

+10% = 2,509 per member

- 10% = 2,052 per member

Therefore for each ward;

Tirau could lose 148 or gain 309;

Putaruru could lose 404 or gain 967;

Tokoroa could lose 1738 or gain 1004;

persons and remain within the +/- 10% formula.

Also attached is a table that I prepared for the 2006 Review, which illustrates the sort of adjustments that would be required to accommodate some other options (Appendix 1). They are based on the 2004 Election Ward boundaries, before the change made in 2006. The 2008 population figures are not much different from 2006.

Appendix 2 is the Public Notice of Council’s proposals for the 2006 Review showing the sort of information that is typically included.

The Recommendations below are in the alternative.

REVIEW OF REPRESENTATION ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE 2007 TRIENNIAL LOCAL ELECTIONS

On 13 July 2006 the South Waikato District Council reviewed its representation arrangements and resolved that the following proposal shall apply for the Council and the Tirau Community Board for the elections to be held on 13 October 2007:

COUNCIL REPRESENTATION

It is proposed that the Council will comprise 10 members elected from three Wards, and the Mayor elected at large. The three Wards reflect the following identified communities of interest:

Ward	Communities of Interest
Tirau	The township of Tirau and surrounding rural land at the northern end of the district. This includes the more closely settled areas at Okoroire and Tapapa.
Putaruru	The townships of Putaruru and Arapuni and surrounding rural land across the middle of the district. This includes the areas of Puketurua, Waotu, Lichfield and Ngatira.
Tokoroa	The town of Tokoroa and surrounding rural land at the south end of the district. This includes Kinleith and Upper Atiamuri.

NOTE:

This proposal represents a change from the arrangements in place since 1995. The proposal is that part of the boundary between the Putaruru and Tokoroa Wards will be moved southwards so that e.g. properties on the northern side of Matanuku Road and Rollett Road are included in the Putaruru Ward. (They are currently in the Tokoroa Ward.) The accompanying map includes the proposed new boundary.

The boundary change is proposed as a means of retaining the same number of Councillors (10) while complying with the fair representation provisions in Section 19V(2) of the Electoral Act 2001, to which reference is made below. To comply with this provision means increasing the population of the Putaruru Ward by 150 persons.

The Ward names used in this proposal are the ones assigned when the South Waikato District was originally constituted in 1988. They do not have to remain as they are; submissions are invited on renaming any of the Wards.

Under the proposal, the population that each member will represent is as follows:

Ward	Population (Estimated based on 2001 census)	Members	Population Per Member
Tirau	2,120	1	2,120
Putaruru	6,260	3	2,086
Tokoroa	14,480	6	2,413
	<u>22,860</u>	<u>10</u>	

In accordance with Section 19V(2) of the Local Electoral Act 2001 the population that each member represents must be within the range of 22,860± 10% (2,057 to 2,515), unless particular community of interest considerations justify otherwise. All the proposed Wards fall within the prescribed range.

COMMUNITY BOARD REPRESENTATION

It is proposed that the existing Tirau Community will continue and shall have boundaries corresponding with the Tirau Ward. It will be represented by one community board, as follows:

Board	Area of Community
Tirau Community Board	Corresponding with the Tirau Ward

The Tirau Community Board will have four elected members. It will have one appointed member, being the member elected to Council for the Tirau Ward.
