Purpose

1. To provide an update on matters referred to the South Waikato District Council in its report dated 15 March 2023 on Tirau community priorities.

Recommendation

- 2. That the Tirau Community Board:
 - a. Receives and notes the matters outlined in the Tirau Community Board Budget Priorities Update report (ECM # 633865).

Context

- 3. The Tirau Community Board has no delegated budget and is reliant on the South Waikato District Council to fund Local Government services in the Tirau Ward. Several consultation activities were undertaken by the Board to gather input from the community including posting on the Tirau Community Facebook page.
- 4. The Board provided a report to the Council on 15 March 2023 outlining its priorities for consideration by the Council as a part of the Annual Plan and Long Term Planning processes.
- 5. The Council adopted the 2023-24 Annual Plan at its meeting on 29 June 2023. The Long Term Plan 2024-34 process has only recently commenced with the outcome from this required before 30 June 2024.
- 6. This report provides an update the Tirau Community Board on matters referred.

Discussion

7. The following matters were recommended for consideration by the South Waikato District Council for funding:

8. **2023-24 Annual Plan**

 Larger and clearer signage on the main street directing to the parking located on Station Street and Hillcrest Street.

This is being considered in consultation with Waka Kotahi.

- Increased spending on parks including:
 - o play equipment.
 - o water play area.
 - bike racks for the domain.

Fencing of Church Street playground for toddlers.

There currently is minimal budget available for 2023-24 and these matters will need to be considered as part of the Long Term Plan.

• Removal of uneven bricks in footpaths process accelerated to remove public hazard.

Budget is limited and footpath maintenance and renewal is regularly based on priority. Level of spend will be considered as part of the Long Term Plan.

9. **2024-34 Long Term Plan**

The Long Term Plan is currently under review. Tirau Community Board will be consulted as part of that process.

- Current areas of focus for the Tirau Pool in 2023/24 are:
 - Repair the leak in the main pool and re-paint.
 - o Re-paint the small pool.
 - Upgrade the small pool plant.
 - Replace the existing kiosk.
 - Replace tables and poolside benches.
 - o Replace and upgrade showers.
 - Carpark The current space for parking is inadequate in that the area is earthwork only.
 To better provide service for users it is recommended that the carpark be at least sealed with gravel.
- Scooter track and BBQ area at the Okoroire/Prospect Park.
- Traffic Management Plan for the main street of Tirau.

10. Other Matters

- Community input for the naming of the park on the corner of Okoroire and Prospect Streets.
 Refer to Item 7.1 Information and Updates Tirau Ward for further information.
- Clear signage for on-lead and off-lead dog areas at the Tirau Domain, and provision of additional poo bag dispensers.

New modern signage for Dog Exercise Areas will be installed in Lower Domain, "Dogs on Lead" signs will be ordered for installing into Upper Domain as per the Dog Control Policy. A dog litter bag dispenser is already located in the exercise area in the Lower Domain, with another one being installed from the 2023/24 capex funding in the Upper Domain area.

- Support for submission to Waka Kotahi:
 - Traffic build up caused by the pedestrian crossing has been a complaint made by many in the community, and a suggestion to have lights at the crossing to keep traffic flowing has been made.
 - o Signage at the roundabout for the Tirau Domain exit.

Purpose

1. To inform the Tirau Community Board on the design and costs of directional signage to facilities at the Tirau Domain.

Recommendation

- 2. That the Tirau Community Board:
 - a. Receives and notes the Directional Signage Tirau Domain report (ECM # 633583).

Executive Summary

- 3. Planning for directional signage to the Tirau Domain has previously been undertaken.
- 4. Implementation of the signage will be conditional on funding being made available as part of the Long Term Plan process.

Context

- 5. The development of the Tirau Domain has had a long gestation. Momentum built with the preparation of and consultation on the Long Term Plan 2018-28.
- 6. A key project desired by the community and Council was rehabilitation of the Tīrau Domain. Following an extensive engagement exercise with the Tīrau community to determine what the community wanted for the Domain, the most popular elements were incorporated into a concept landscape plan. This concept landscape plan included multiple elements from the Tīrau Bridge and Walkway project.
- 7. Construction was completed in May 2022 and the Domain was formally opened by Mayor Jenny Shattock in July 2022.
- 8. As part of the project scope, the intention was to install:
 - Wayfinding signage withing the borders of the Domain this work was completed prior to the opening.
 - State Highway and local road signage, directing people to the Domain from SH1 (North and South) and SH5.
- Due to a variety of factors, the process of obtaining Waka Kotahi approval of the proposed signage took longer than expected with approved drawings not being received until August 2022.
 Again, despite our best efforts, we did not receive a quotation to supply/install this signage until

October 2022. At this time there was no budget available for the project and so the work did not proceed.

Options

- 10. Our original intention was to install Brown Tourist signs (white lettering on light brown background) and this is what was originally submitted to Waka Kotahi. However, Waka Kotahi responded that "the Domain does not meet the criteria for Tourist signs" and that we should instead use "Motor Service" signs which have white symbols on a blue background.
- 11. Attached are the approved drawings for the four signs.

Financial Considerations

- 12. We received a quotation from **directionz**, our local supplier/installer of road signs totalling \$21,212 excluding GST. However, a new quotation will be required which, given current inflationary pressures, is likely to be higher than this amount.
- 13. Funding for the signs will need to be considered as part of the Long Term Plan development process.

Risks


- 14. Since the quotation received was dated 28 October 2022, a new quotation will be required if the work is to proceed.
- 15. We should ratify the design with Waka Kotahi again, if the work is to proceed, due to the time passed since the original approval.

Blue signs: Parking, Toilets



CW NOC network controls, in conjunction with Waka Kotahi, it is agreed that the Tirau Domain should have signage to guide traffic as appropriate.

Our assessment indicates that the Domain does not meet the criteria for Tourist signs. Motor Service signs can be applied to the Domain.

The Motor Service signs and Tirau Domain name (blue finger sign with white lettering) can be installed on the Advance Direction signs for the correct leg of the roundabout. It may be possible that the information can fit onto this sign layout as it is.






<u>2: Travelling North on SH1</u>
Brown sign – turn left to Domain (on roundabout sign in distance) Blue signs: Parking, Toilets








<u>6: Oxford Royal Hotel SH1 (on lamppost)</u> Brown sign – to Tirau Domain

No signage is to be located in these areas to indicate to traffic to leave SH1. SWDC can install signage within the SWDC local road network.







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
