THE APPLICATION

1) We have before us the second application by **SK & GS ENTERPRISES** Limited (the Applicant), for the grant of a second Temporary Authority for an On-licence operation pursuant to s.136 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), in respect of premises situated at 26 Tīrau Street, Putaruru and known as "**POST SEAFOOD & GRILL CAFÉ**".

2) The first temporary authority expired on 8 May 2018 and upon request the applicant removed all alcohol.

3) The Inspector has filed a positive report on the application and recommends the grant of the second Temporary Authority.

4) The Police have reported on the application without opposition.

THE DECISION

5) Accordingly, we are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard, and we are satisfied that the application meets the purpose and object of the Act, and we grant the application. The Temporary Authority 17/TA/11/2017 authorises the applicant to conduct the sale of alcohol of On-licence number; 17/ON/006/2015 subject to the conditions contained in that licence.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

6) The Licensing Inspector has enquired into the suitability of the applicant and found the applicant to be of suitable character and reputation.

7) The applicant has sufficient staff numbers and the appropriate systems and staff training.

8) There was no opposition to the grant of a Temporary Authority from the Police.

9) The Applicant will need to obtain the substantive On-licence, and that must be applied for and granted prior to the expiry of this Temporary Authority.

10) It is unlikely that the Committee will grant a third temporary authority

11) Section 136 of the Act provides the Committee with the ability to set any conditions that should apply to the premises operating under a Temporary Authority. In this case the Committee has determined that the conditions found on the base licence are to be retained.

11) The Temporary Authority is granted for a maximum period of 3 months pursuant to section 136(1) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 with the expiry date being the of May 2018.
