IN THE MATTER of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012(The Act)

AND

THE MATTER OF an application by **ARDOUR GROUP LIMITED** pursuant to s100 of the Act for an On-licence in respect of premises situated at 79 Princes Street, Putaruru, and known as "**PUTĀRURU HOTEL**".

THE APPLICATION:

The Ardour Group Limited filed an application pursuant to s.100 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 for an On-licence in respect of premises situated at 79 Princes Street, Putaruru trading as "**PUTĀRURU HOTEL**"

The applicant is a company incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 10 December 2018. The business is an established hotel, restaurant and function centre. There will be three certificated managers employed.

The applicant seeks the following hours:

- Monday to Sunday - 10.00am to 11.00pm for the restaurant known as "The Cook Bistro"
- Monday to Sunday - 10.00 am to 1.00 am the following day to the remainder of the premises.

The application was publicly notified in the South Waikato News on 3 and 10 April 2019 and an onsite notice was also posted

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The application is complete and contains all the supporting documents as required under s.100 of the Act. It was duly advertised and no objection, opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

The Licensing Inspector does not oppose this application.

The Police do not oppose this application.

The Medical Officer of Health does not oppose the application.

The premises meets the requirements of the Resource Management Act 1991.

The premise meets the requirements of the Building Code.

The premises is part designated "supervised" which is appropriate for this type of business.

Currently the South Waikato does not have a Local Alcohol Policy.

No objections were received as the result any advertisement placed.

The applicant inadvertently omitted the days in the advertisement and applied for a Waiver under s.208 of the Act which I have approved as I do not believe that any person was disadvantaged by this omission.

Overall I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee Chairperson, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, approves the application subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

- (a) The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages. Drinking water must be available to customers free of charge upon request.
- (b) No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day to any person other than any person who is present on the premises for the purpose of dining.
- (c) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 10.00 am to 11.00 pm for "The Cook Bistro";
Monday to Sunday 10.00 am to 1.00 am the following day to the remainder of the premises EXCEPT THAT on the Thursday before Good Friday; and on Easter Saturday; and on Christmas Eve; and on the day before Anzac Day, liquor may only be sold between 10.00 am and 12.00 midnight.
- (d) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol in accordance with the menu submitted with the application for a licence, or variations of that menu of a similar range and standard.
- (e) **The house bar is designated as a supervised area: the remainder of the premises is undesignated**
- (f) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
- (g) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- (h) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons
